#### **Memorial Wall**



### About That Hymn



#### **O Valiant Hearts**

O valiant hearts who to your glory came Through dust of conflict and through battle flame; Tranquil you lie, your knightly virtue proved, Your memory hallowed in the land you loved.

Proudly you gathered, rank on rank, to war As who had heard God's message from afar; All you had hoped for, all you had, you gave, To save mankind - yourselves you scorned to save.

The words to this stirring memorial hymn were written by John Stanhope Arkwright in 1917. Born in London in 1872, from a well-known, well-to-do English family, Arkwright studied at Eton College and Oxford University and served as MP for Hereford. He was knighted in 1934 and died in 1954.

This hymn, especially written to remember the fallen of World War 1, was so well loved that it was chosen to be sung at the burial service of the Unknown Warrior in Westminster Abbey, London, on Remembrance Day, November 11, 1920, as the choir entered in procession. The tune "Ellers", used for that occasion, was written by Edward John Hopkins (1818-1901); he was the organist at Temple Church, London, for over 50 years.

The words of this hymn remind us of the reason why on Anzac Day, Remembrance Day, and other special days, we gather to remember and give thanks for the sacrifices made unselfishly by so many, sacrifices we should never take for granted.

This hymn is always sung at the service at the Cross of Sacrifice in the Pennington Gardens in North Adelaide, following the Anzac Day march through Adelaide.
